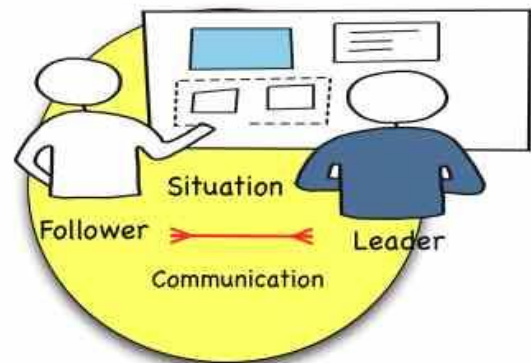
Factors of leadership:
